ILIDS data was obtained by the county for the summer. Rufer will do some further analysis.

Horstmann reported on the bylaws. He is working on revisions that can be presented for approval at next year's Annual Meeting. Elshaug reported that he was pleased with how the Annual Meeting went.

It was discussed that Rufer put together a summary for the PLPOA E-communications about the tree program and the algae bloom.

It was decided that the next meeting be at the Elshaug residence at 5:00pm on December 14. Swenson made a motion to adjourn at 8:22pm; Kruse seconded it and it passed.
